Christina Dimopoulou was born 1981 in Thessaloniki, Greece and graduated 1999 from the German School of Thessaloniki scoring “excellent”.

From 1999 to 2005 she studied human medicine at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece and completed her studies scoring “very good”.

In 2006, she has been accepted as a scholar in the prestigious research institute Max Planck Institute for Psychiatry in Munich, Germany. In 2008, she was awarded the doctoral degree of “Doctor of Medicine” (Dr. med.) from the Ludwig Maximilians University of Munich.

During her training, she has been an assistant of the renowned Prof. Dr. G.K. Stalla at the Department of Internal Medicine, Endocrinology and Clinical Chemistry at the Max Planck Institute and at the Medizinische Klinik und Poliklinik IV of the Ludwig Maximilians University, in Munich. In January 2014, she was been acknowledged as a “Specialist in Internal Medicine, Endocrinology and Diabetology” by the Bavarian State Chamber of Physicians (BLÄK) after successful exam.

She conducts significant research activity in the field of Clinical Neuroendocrinology, results of which have been published in leading german and international medical journals including "*The Journal of Clinical Endocrinology & Metabolism*" and "*European Journal of Endocrinology*" and presented at international conferences. In 2013, her research work has been distinguished by the Section of Applied Endocrinology of the German Endocrine Society (DGE).

Today, she is a research associate in the Department of Clinical Research at the Max Planck Institute for Psychiatry in Munich, Germany and has a private practice in Thessaloniki. At the same time, she is preparing her habilitation (university-lecturer qualification) at the Medical Faculty of the LMU, Munich.
